Check the seal of your elastomeric full face, 6 strap respirator each time you don the respirator.



1. Positive Pressure User Seal Check

Place the palm of your hand over the exhalation valve cover and *exhale* gently. The facepiece should bulge slightly. If air leaks between the face and the faceseal of the respirator, reposition it and adjust the straps for a tighter seal. If you cannot

achieve a proper seal, **do not** enter the contaminated area. See your supervisor.



2. Negative Pressure User Seal Check

Using Particulate Filters

Place your thumbs over the center of the particulate filters and *inhale* gently. The facepiece should collapse slightly. If air leaks between the face and the faceseal of the respirator, reposition it and adjust the straps for a tighter seal. If you cannot achieve a proper seal, **do not** enter the contaminated area. See your supervisor.



Using Cartridges

Place the palms of your hands over the cartridges and *inhale* gently. The facepiece should collapse slightly.
